# Category Rules

Theme: Why Mental Health Matters to Me Submit by March 15, 2018

### **POSTER ART**

<ul> <li>Must be an original artwork that combines drawing, pictures (and words if you wish) to express the contest theme.</li> <li>Materials used may include pencil, ink, charcoal, crayon, markers, pastel, paint, mixed media, collage or similar 2D media</li> <li>Poster must be no larger than 11 inches by 17 inches.</li> <li>Student's first and last name and student's school must be on the back of the poster.</li> </ul>
WRITING
☐ Must be a story, essay or poem based on the contest theme and no longer than 300 words.
☐ Must be typed or, if handwritten, must be legible.
□ Please ask an adult to review spelling and grammar for errors before you submit.
☐ Student's first and last name and student's school must be on the back of the page.
VIDEO
☐ Must be an original video no longer than 120 seconds that addresses this year's theme.
<ul> <li>You can submit an individual or group entry (each participant whose face is shown must complete an entry form).</li> <li>The video must be posted on YouTube or Vimeo and must be appropriate for children.</li> </ul>

Photos can't show a person's face.
